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I would like to thank all our members for their support and their work throughout the year, our parent members: Andreina Balog, Francis de Courcy, , Josiane Hebert-Desmarais, Alexandra Gagnon, & Vanessa Pietrarroia. Our teacher members include: Aurora D'Anna, Sophie Geoffroy, Tara Marlin, Margrete White, and; our Day-Care member: Genevieve Beaudry-Paquette and our support staff representative: Danny Jack. I would also like to thank our principal Dan Tremblay.

Joliette Elementary School is a public English school with 276 students within the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board. Our governing board held its general assembly of parents on September 10, 2021 and has conducted 8 (one without quorum) monthly meetings over the course of the 2021-2022 school year.

The governing board fulfilled its functions as prescribed in the Quebec Education Act. We voted to maintain our current Subject-Time Allocation for the 2022-2023 school year; We approved the school's annual operating budget for the 2022-2023 school year which includes consumable, supervision and school activity fees. Our school strives to maintain fees at the lowest level possible and to create reasonable supply lists which place the least financial burden on our community.

We have worked on the SWLSB Budget Building Process Consultation, Joliette Elementary Anti-Bullying, Anti-Violence Plan, Criteria for the Selection of Principal, and Deeds of Establishment, Sexuality Education Plan, Academic & Career Guidance Content Plan, as well as other consultations requested by the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board Council of Commissioners.

The governing board also approved the reception of \$228,582.00 in MEES measure grants for a variety of student learning support and activities. In addition, our Governing Board approved our participation in the Breakfast Club of Canada that contributed over \$65,000 in breakfast snacks for the 2021-2022 school year.

Four portable classroom were installed at JES to alleviate crowding however, the consequence is the use of the school's paved basketball court. This has left our already small yard even more cramped. A sub-committee has been struck to explore options and give recommendations to the SWLSB Material Resources Dept. for improvement. In addition, a governing board sanctioned a fundraiser to provide funds for our future schoolyard improvement project. Our "Yard Fund" is currently \$17,000. Moving forward the sub-committee will

formulate recommendations for improvement and a project proposal will be submitted to the MEES by the end of 2022.

The Governing Board of Joliette Elementary wishes to thank teachers for providing an enriching school environment, extra-curricular activities and continuous support during the Covid 19 Pandemic. We would also like to thank our Breakfast Club volunteers for their full-year commitment to feeding our students.
